Ulcombe History Society's trip to Mediaeval France Friday 3rd July to Sunday 5th July

There are still a few spaces available on this exciting trip. Many of you will have seen on television the building from scratch of a mediaeval castle at Guedelon, and this is one of the places we will be visiting.

We leave Ulcombe at 7.30 am on the Friday and make our way to the magnificent Chateau-Le-Vicomte which was constructed between 1658 and 1661 for Nicolas Fouquet, Viscount of Melun and Vaux, who was Superintendent of the finances of Louis XIV.

We stay in a hotel in Auxerre or Sens, and on Saturday morning make our way to the mediaeval castle in making, Guedelon, where we will have a guided tour.

We will then go on to Chateau de Ratilly, a 12th century castle and pottery, whose design inspired the lay out of Guedelon. The chateau has frequent art exhibitions.

Saturday evening we return to the hotel for an evening meal.

Then on Sunday morning we drive to Provins which is a World Heritage Site with a wonderfully preserved 13^{th} century fortified town wall, a central tower (Caesar's Tower) build in the 12^{th} century, a 13^{th} century tithe barn, underground galleries and many other interesting features.

We aim to be back in Ulcombe about 9 pm.

The estimated cost of the trip is £220. This includes coach, hotel accommodation (B&B – double occupancy), entrance and guides to all four visits. Dinner both evenings will be extra.

Zooming

Have you ever accidently made the text in your internet browser so small you can't read the writing, and don't know how it happened or how to fix it?

This would have happened because you would have been holding the Crtl Key down and pressed the minus (-) sign at the same time (without knowing you did it).



To fix this in Google – go to the settings, which is the button with the three lines in the top right-hand corner of the browser. You will see the Zoom controls about half-way down. Just increase the view by clicking on the "+" until it reaches 100%. You can make it larger than 100% if you would like to view text larger than normal.



To fix this in Internet Explorer – go to settings, which is the cog in the top right-hard corner of the browser. Select Zoom, which will give you another drop-down menu. You can select which ever % you would like. Also you can select a custom zoom, which gives you more flexibility.



Lost Toolbar

Similarly, have you ever lost the menus or toolbars from the top of the application, like Internet Explorer or Word. This can happen in many applications, and would have happened because you were clicking in that area and accidently clicked on the option to stop showing them.

In Internet Explorer for example, in the screen shown here, the items ticked are displayed. If you click on them again they will stop being displayed. NB: Lock the toolbars means they stay visible when the mouse is in that area, if unselected they will disappear until you point to the menu and toolbar area, when they get automatically displayed again.



To get this menu to appear, you need to point the mouse in that area, then use the Right-Mouse click. This will display the menu, you can then select the item to display it. This type of tick is known as a "toggle", which is like an on/off button.

This screen shows the Word application. In Word the options available to you are called Ribbons, so you can see from this menu that you can Minimise the Ribbon or not. If you have selected Minimise, it will disappear until you point the mouse in that area.

Grafty Gourmet

This is a variation from the usual use of lemon juice used when cooking lamb. Great for a Sunday Roast, with a Greek twist. Serve with vegetables of your choice.

Greek Orange Roast Lamb

Half a leg of lamb 10 to 12 medium-sized potatoes, peeled and cut into 5cm pieces 5 cloves garlic 4 tablespoons of French mustard Juice of one large orange 1 tablespoon oregano 3 tablespoons olive oil salt and pepper (to taste)

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180 C. In large bowl, whisk together the orange juice, mustard, olive oil, oregano, salt and pepper.
- 2. Once combined, add potatoes to bowl and coat thoroughly with mixture. Transfer the potatoes to a large roasting tin.
- 3. Next, cut 2cm deep slits into the lamb, and stuff the garlic cloves into the slits. Place the lamb into the bowl with the remaining orange juice mixture; coat thoroughly and transfer to roasting tin on top of the potatoes. If any of the orange juice mixture remains in the bowl, pour over the lamb and potatoes.
- 4. Bake uncovered until potatoes are done and lamb is cooked medium (approximately 60 minutes). Check every 20 to 30 minutes while baking, and add a bit of hot water if you find the potatoes are drying out

I was watching a father encouraging his young son to go off on his bicycle without the stabilisers. It took me back to when youngest son, Paul, was at that same stage. And so I pray that when you are finding life is hard and maybe the days are dark, that you will have that same faith to trust in the future, confident that whatever may be asked of you, you will know God surrounds you with his loving care, holding you close.
