A 'Thank you' from Richard & Sandra Pilborough

We would like to thank the Grafty Green community for their concern and support for Richard's mother, Nora, who passed away recently.

Nora and her husband, Charles, were made to feel so welcome when they moved to Grafty Green 14 years ago and, when Charles died, he did so knowing that Nora was in a safe and friendly place where others would be looking out for her.

At the Post Office Store, a friendly chat would always accompany help with her shopping and, when the shop was closed, Ken & Eve and their customers at the Kings Head would meet her need for cigarettes (and, on at least one occasion, dog food!) before seeing her safely on her way home.

As her dementia worsened, she began to wander and was more than once rescued by neighbours, either from the road or just from her own front garden.

In her final months Nora was cared for in a home and she died peacefully on 7 February after a 3 week stay in hospital. During this time we much appreciated the concern expressed by villagers, several of whom attended her funeral service at Charing Crematorium.

The true spirit of village life still thrives in Grafty, and we're so grateful that it does.

The Grafty Gourmet

This is a popular Jamaican chicken recipe, and a great alternative to Indian curries. Serve on a bed of rice with mango chutney or yogurt as a condiment.

Jamaican Chicken Curry

Serves 2

2 tbsps vegetable oil

2 garlic cloves, finely chopped

3 spring onions (chopped)

2 chicken breasts (cubed)

1 tsp curry powder

1 tsp all spice

2 medium potatoes (diced)

1/4 cup of frozen peas (thawed)

½ cup Chicken Stock

1 inch grated fresh ginger

1/4 cup coconut milk

- 1. In a frying pan, heat the oil (on low temperature) and fry the garlic until golden brown. if oil is too hot, the garlic will burn.
- 2. Add the curry powder and all spice, stir to mix thoroughly, and cook for 1 minute.
- 3. Add the chicken and stir well to coat the meat in the curry mixture and fry for about 5 minutes.
- 4. Add the onion, potato, ginger and chicken stock, and stir-fry over medium heat until the potato is just cooked (about 30 minutes).
- 5. Stir in the coconut milk, and simmer gently until the sauce thickens.
- 6. Turn into a bed of rice and serve.

Council Tax

The lowest increase in county council tax since its inception 17 years ago was agreed at the full meeting of KCC on 18 February. This year's council tax will increase the KCC precept by 2.1%, which means that a Band D property will increase from £1,026.27 to £1,047.78, an extra payment of 41p a week. It is expected that this will give Kent the 9th lowest Band D rate of any comparable authority.

Potholes

In the coming months KCC will employ Kent based small and medium sized resurfacing companies to undertake urgent pothole repairs. The usual contractor, Ringway, will not be used for this work. This will provide a boost to local firms in difficult economic times and we will only use those firms that have a track record of delivering good value for money. A couple of local companies have already been recommended to me and I have passed their details on to Kent Highways Services.

HOSC

I am a member of the Kent County Council Health and Overview Scrutiny Committee, which met on 19 February to debate the proposal of the Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells Primary Care Trust to remove consultants from Maidstone's Hospital maternity unit and instead centralise consultants at the new PFI hospital in Pembury. This would mean that women experiencing high risk pregnancies and likely to require clinical intervention would not be able to give birth in the midwifery-led birthing unit proposed for Maidstone (no doubt diverting patients to Medway and Ashford rather than Pembury given the poor transport links). I highlighted the danger posed to women whom, having experienced low-risk pregnancies, would enter the

birthing unit only to suffer serious complications in birth and then have to be transferred to Pembury – a transfer time of an hour at least! My concern for the safety of women and babies in this situation was shared by colleagues in the Committee but health officials steadfastly refused to acknowledge the inherent dangers of their plans. Instead they argued that KCC and other agencies should lobby for a Colts Hill bypass – KCC has been doing this for well over a decade but this has not been high on the list of the Government's funding priorities. In light of the current economic difficulties, funding for large transport infrastructure schemes will be difficult to access. Members of the Committee unanimously agreed to reject the proposals and referred the matter to the Health Secretary to investigate. Hopefully common sense will prevail and these nonsensical plans will be thrown out.



Music Notes, March 2010

After the widely acclaimed powerful performance of Handel's Messiah last Autumn, Maidstone Choral Union's Christmas Concert, at which they were ably assisted by Brunswick House School choir and expertly accompanied by BAE Systems Brass Band, was predictably more informal in style. Although Music Director Martin Hindmarsh was missing, MCU were privileged to have his identical twin Paul conducting (how many of those present could really see the difference?!) With Paul's reputation from the world of Brass Bands the band was thrilled to be conducted by him.

MCU will be returning to religious works for the next concert on March 20th at which they will present three very different interpretations of the Gloria, starting with the vibrant and dynamic *Gloria* by Francis Poulenc the French 20th Century composer, premiered in 1961.

They then move to the late 19th Century with Giacomo Puccini's *Messa di Gloria*, which strictly speaking is a short Mass. Puccini wrote this as his graduation exercise at the age of 22 and it is an unmistakeably youthful, exuberant work, full of delightful melodies and all the signs of the magnificent operatic music that was to come. Indeed he did use some of the themes in subsequent operas.

In this journey back through musical tine they finally reach the early 18th century with the ever popular *Gloria* of Antonio Vivaldi. This is a cheerful and lively work typical of that composer. It is regularly performed as a concert piece and on special occasions in church and it has been used to great effect in a number of films.

Speed limits

(from "Newnes motorists touring guide")

"[Although] the car [may be] fully equipped and ready to take the road, the motorist has still to acquaint himself with the law as it affects the driver. The twenty-mile sped limit is still in force, and though it is broken by every driver every day, yet anyone is liable to be summoned for exceeding it. The driver cannot, however, be convicted unless warned at the time or unless notice of prosecution is sent within a reasonable time, not exceeding twenty-one days. There must also be two witnesses to the offence, or one who was in a position to time the car over a measured distance with a stopwatch. The speed limits enforced in various towns and villages must be strictly observed. They are usually ten miles an hour but sometimes five.

Readers today may envy the restrictions on prosecution outlined here, but not, perhaps, the legal limits. Our edition of the guide published in the late 1920's was sold at The Great Leeds Book Sale but, in response to popular request, the facility to publish extracts has been allowed to continue for the time being, subject to the editor's approval.

Have you clicked on 'Love life, live Lent'? This is a website (www.livelent.net) which invites you to join the online community if you are a member of Facebook or use My Space. Have a look and see. There are also 'Love life, live Lent' booklets for all ages. It's all about being good neighbours. That's what Jesus tells us to do. Lent is not just about giving things up. It's certainly not about using Lent to go on a diet, though I guess many people hope that if they stick to giving up chocolates or alcohol they will lose a bit of weight! No, Lent is about actively trying to come closer to being the people God wants us to be. It is about taking time to read and pray. It is about giving time to others, to those less fortunate than ourselves. You may have joined a Lent group for this important time. You may be still thinking about joining. It is not too late to sign up for one.

During these weeks of Lent, which began on February 17th, we can take the opportunity to put our faith into action.
