Village Hall News - August Newsletter

Dear All,

As you all probably know by now the hall will be closed for the electrical rewire to take place for four weeks between Monday 4th August and Friday 29th August. As trustees we are confident that the work can be completed within this timeframe but with all projects of this nature you never know what unexpected problems might arise and I will endeavour to keep you updated as soon as possible if there is any unexpected delay with the reopening. Hopefully this will not be necessary and of course if the work is completed before the end of August we will endeavour to reopen the hall as soon as possible.

We will need to carry out some making good to the internal fabric of the hall once the rewire is complete to make the hall safe for hall users and then redecorate internally. The redecoration and any non-essential making good will be undertaken during the break over the Christmas period after the Christmas Quiz which will be held on Saturday 13th December and before the Panto which will be held on Saturday 10th January.

Whilst the electrical works are being completed there will be some alternative temporary arrangements in place in order to keep any disruption to hall users to a minimum as follows:

Coffee Mornings - There will be 3 coffee mornings which will be held at the Church on Tuesday 5th, Tuesday 19th and Tuesday 26th August 12.00 noon -2.00 pm. Please note there will not be a coffee morning on Tuesday 12th August. We are trying to arrange for the Post Office to attend these coffee mornings, and I look forward to this in hope rather than expectation.

Farmer's Market – Weather permitting the farmer's market will be held on the village green for the four Fridays of 8th, 15th, 22nd & 29th August 1pm to 3pm.

Pilates Classes – Will be held at Ulcombe Village Hall at the usual time of 9.30 am to 10.30 am on a Tuesday morning whilst the village hall is closed.

The trustees look forward to welcoming you all back to the hall in September and as always, we thank you for your ongoing support for the village hall.

The Grafty Gourmet

This is another very simple yet great summer recipe. Strawberries with an Italian twist.

If like me, you like Limoncello, then you'll love this!

INDIVIDUAL STRAWBERRY & LIMONCELLO CHEESECAKES

200g of strawberries, hulled and quartered 75ml of limoncello 50g of icing sugar 250g tub of mascarpone cheese 150g of full-fat cream cheese 2 teaspoons of vanilla bean paste 150g of amaretti biscuits 25g of toasted flaked almonds

- 1. Mix together the strawberries, limoncello and icing sugar in a bowl and leave for 10 minutes for the strawberries to soak.
- 2. With a hand-held electric whisk, gently beat together the mascarpone, cream cheese and vanilla bean paste until smooth. Strain the strawberries over a bowl and set aside. Add the limoncello liquid to the mascarpone mixture and beat to combine.
- 3. Put the amaretti biscuits in a food bag and crush with a rolling pin into large crumbs, then divide among 4 to 6 250ml glasses or dessert bowls, reserving about 2 tablespoons of the biscuit pieces.
- 4. Spoon the mascarpone mixture over the biscuits, and top with the strawberries, almonds and reserved biscuit crumbs.

Gardening Tips Gardening tips for August

- Keep beds and containers looking good by regular dead heading and cutting back dead growth
- > Harvest vegetables regularly so they keep on producing
- Water and feed containers. If you are going away put all your pots in the shade with saucers/receptacles under and hope for rain! Or ask a neighbour
- > Trim hedges, particularly evergreen hedges
- Collect seeds
- Sow hardy annuals
- > Take semi ripe cuttings of salvia and hydrangeas
- Pinch out the tops of tomato plants growing in the greenhouse, so fruits develop. Can also do the same for cucumbers and squash
- And there's always weeding!

The dry spring and warm early summer have been a bonus for the insects; you may have had the pleasure of butterflies dancing around your garden recently. The cabbage whites have naturally laid their eggs on my cavolo nero (preferring that to the sprouting broccoli) and the caterpillars are decimating the leaves! However, there is a wasps' nest in the crevices of the dry-stone wall on one of my boundaries and now the wasps are gorging themselves on the caterpillars! Food chain in action!







Rest for the Soul

August is here! The days are longer, the sun is shining, and it's (usually) warm and pleasant! For many, August brings a much-needed chance to slow down. With my children on school holidays, it's great fun to spend more time together as a family, though I must admit, the noise levels around the house do rise a bit! August often means time off work, whether you're heading away on holiday or simply enjoying a slower pace at home. It's a natural moment to pause, breathe, and reset.


