

The revised scheme has been displayed on the notice boards and the village shop window along with the Parish Council website. The comments received were in support of the revised scheme. The Council resolved to now invite Kent County Council to review the scheme to ensure that it meets their regulations, and to provide a costing to carry out the works for us. The Parish Council is waiting to hear back from KCC and will hold a further meeting when a response is received. The Council will continue to keep residents up to date with developments via Malherbe Monthly.

Important Information From Boughton Malherbe Parish Council

Government Help for the most medically vulnerable residents who have been advised to self isolate at home for a period of 3 months and do not have support from family and friends to help with shopping, collecting prescriptions etc.

In response to Government requests, Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) has set up a Community Hub to assist vulnerable residents within the Borough during the **Coronavirus** emergency.

The Hub aims to provide similar assistance to that set up by the Boughton Malherbe Parish Community Emergency Plan, which you can read about elsewhere in this magazine and on the Parish Council website.

It is understood that the Hub can provide the added benefit of free Grocery parcels which is something that our own Emergency Plan could not do on a regular basis.

We hope to co-operate with the Hub to ensure that its supplies and services get to the needy within our Parish, as and when required.

The news of the MBC Hub came after our own Community Emergency Plan was set up, and too late for us to establish and publish in this magazine the full details of exactly how the Hub will work, and how our Community Emergency Plan can work alongside it.

Parish Councillor Vacancies

As a result of the postponement of the 2020 Parish Council election, there are two vacancies for councillors on the Parish Council. The Parish Council would like to co-opt two residents to fill these vacancies on a temporary basis until the postponed election takes place in May 2021. We would like to hear from anyone who is interested in volunteering for these positions who:

- meet the criteria for eligibility, set out in s. 79 of the 1972 Act, to be a member of the council and
- are not disqualified, pursuant to s.80 of the 1972 Act, to be a member of the council.

The role involves attending Parish Council meetings and contributing to decisions taken by the Council and, potentially, taking the lead on a specific area of activity such as Highways or Crime related matters.

You will be required to complete a declaration of pecuniary interests and sign a declaration of acceptance of office at your first meeting.

Neighbourhood Watch - Covid 19 Advice

Covid 19 Scam Prevention Advice

Scammers and criminals are already looking for opportunities to scam people as a result of the Coronavirus / COVID-19 pandemic. Happily, there are many more stories of kindness and generosity but we want to make people aware of the scams as they emerge – which they seem to be on a daily basis.

There have been reports received by Kent Police of people door-knocking and claiming to be from the Health Authority.

What happens:

- The criminal knocks on your door.
- They claim to be from the Health Authority.
- They offer to do COVID-19 testing on residents.
- There are also reports of the criminal offering to take the residents temperature.

THIS IS A SCAM!

What to do:

- Do not let them in.
- Do not allow them to take any money or details from you
- Report to Kent Police on 101.
- If you ask them to leave and they don't, contact the police on 999.

Please warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.

Report

There has been a report of an elderly Kent resident who lost money when they gave their bank card to someone who offered to do some shopping for them. They received one of these cards through their door and an individual offered to help, however, they actually stole money from the resident and were not seen again.

Payment

Don't ever give your bank or card details to anyone, even if you think you know them

very well. You could either agree to pay in cash after they have delivered the shopping or pay them online if you have the facility to do so. Or maybe you could agree another method of payment - **but never give your bank or card details.**

Meanwhile:- Your Gardens in June have probably never looked better and with the weather improving all the time we can all spend as long as we wish enjoying them. Watering remains the main need with a good soaking during dry spells giving the greatest benefit, especially to young plants. Gaps in planting can be filled with summer bedding plants and a liquid fertiliser will bring great benefit to the lawn with no need to water it in!

Grafty Gourmet

I thought I would do a chocolate-based recipe this month. I don't know about you, but chocolate is a good "pick me up", especially during these difficult times. And anyone who knows me, knows that I can never say no to chocolate ! This is a different kind of a brownie recipe which does not use flour. It makes it more of a chocolate indulgence. The chocolate sauce is optional, and I must warn, it is very very chocolatey ! Serve with ice cream and the hot chocolate sauce for extra "pick me up".

Chocolate Brownies with Chocolate Sauce

For the Brownies:

225 grams of dark chocolate (minimum 70% cocoa solids)
225 grams of butter
2 teaspoons of vanilla extract
200 grams of caster sugar
3 large eggs (beaten)
150 grams of ground almonds
100 grams of chopped walnuts

For the Hot Chocolate Sauce:

75 grams of dark chocolate (minimum 70% cocoa solids)
125 millilitres of double cream
2 teaspoons of instant espresso powder
1 tablespoons of water
1 tablespoon of golden syrup

For the Brownies:

1. Preheat the oven to 170°C (150°C Fan Oven). Melt the chocolate and butter gently over a low heat in a heavy-based saucepan.
2. Take the pan off the heat and mix in the vanilla and sugar, and let it cool a little, before adding the eggs (the eggs will start cooking if the chocolate is too warm, but you do not want the chocolate to go solid again). Once cooled, Beat the eggs into the pan along with the ground almonds and chopped walnuts. Turn into a 24cm / 9-inch square baking tin. Use a foil one if possible, as this makes it easier to get the Brownie out after baking.
3. Bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes, by which time the top will have set but the mixture will still be gooey. (Do not over cook, as the top will burn. The centre is supposed to be slightly squidgy, but will go solid once cooled). When cooled, cut carefully, four down, four across, into 16 squares.

For the Sauce:

1. Break up the chocolate and put into a heavy-based saucepan.
2. Dissolve the instant espresso powder in the water and add this, along with the remaining ingredients into the saucepan, then place the pan over a gentle heat and let everything melt together.
Once everything has melted, stir well, take off the heat and pour into a jug to serve.
3. Enjoy !

Raw in tooth & claw....

I am writing this early in the month of May, and in the last few days have been hearing the cuckoo call, regularly. The old saying tells us that the cuckoo "sings his song in May" and sure enough, that he is doing. We welcome it as a sign that reassures us that the world continues as normal in spite of the dreaded virus. Yet it is a normality that is just as harsh as our epidemic. Every cuckoo we hear has reached adulthood by murdering all its stepbrothers and sisters!

Then we all love the robin, don't we? I had a friendly robin that sang beautifully and followed me really closely whenever I appeared in the garden. He would come within inches of me as soon as I started digging or weeding. I enjoyed his company, yet was aware that he was a bully to all the other birds and would attack much larger avians to preserve his territory. And of course, what he was looking for was not my friendship but worms and insects to eat! And then nature caught up with him. One afternoon recently I was kneeling in the garden dealing with some obstinate weeds and he was right up close looking for food, when something large and feathered came from behind me, brushing my shoulder. In an instant it grabbed the robin, and flew away, almost before I could move and certainly before I could identify it – though probably it was a sparrow hawk, as I know they are in the area.

So, what is the lesson? The world we live in has both beauty and brutality. As humans we are part of the world, not apart from it and not beyond its reach; we can enjoy nature but should accept that nature has its dark side which affects us just as the beauty inspires us. The Covid-19 is very much an example of that dark side but it is part of our world, not the end of it. Within a few days of the loss of my friendly robin another appeared, but one which was less "tame" - much more cautious. Eventually we too will get back to a normal life, though perhaps having learnt some lessons.

Music Notes for June 2020

As I write this there are small signs of an easing of the virus lockdown, but no chance of live concerts in our area in June, if only because no musicians have met for rehearsals. However, professionals have been finding a way to perform, albeit without audience and as result good music is available to us through the media. If you have access to the internet, I would refer you to:

This site gives you access to a whole range of excellent performances. They are cleverly put together recordings of choir or orchestra members performing individually at home. It looks as if it is a simple “zoom” exercise that so many of us are learning to use with our families, but be assured it is much more sophisticated. Zoom does not work successfully with joint music performance because the timing varies from individual home computer to individual – I know, I have experienced it! Each of these individual performers playing on this site has had to play and record their part to a very precise timing so that they can subsequently be put together – “mixed” – successfully with skilful editing.

Then there is the radio – a provider of recorded music that has come into its own during this emergency. In June BBC3 is planning to reintroduce live concerts. They are bringing together in the Wigmore Hall small numbers of musicians who live in the London Area to perform concerts which will be broadcast live almost every weekday in the month. The forecast programme shows that sometimes the Wigmore Hall concert will fill the 1.00pm lunchtime concert slot, and sometimes the 7.30pm “radio 3 in concert” slot. My pick of the month however is the recorded radio 3 concert on Wednesday 17th at 7.30pm from St. Paul’s Church, Knightsbridge in which the BBC singers perform English madrigals and motets.

And finally, TV. The BBC Young Musician finals will be available in full on BBC iPlayer and it is said that highlights will be shown on BBC4, but at a “time to be advised” – so look out for them. Also, a three-part instalment of the series on Beethoven is promised, but again no timings available as we go to press. In any case, as the virus emergency changes, no advanced programming for either radio or TV can be guaranteed.

The musicians dictionary continues in lockdown: Oboe – An ill wind that nobody blows good.



Christian Message June 2020 by Pamela Cuerden

Sat here on 26th April, just a few days before the June magazines deadline, I must focus and prayerfully write the Christian message. Normally I have two or three articles or anecdotes up my sleeve, but knowing that I must address the current situation, I have to admit that after a couple of false starts, I have been procrastinating. There are too many unknowns and by the time you read this we may no longer be in lockdown – or we may have had it extended? Who knows?

But maybe that's the point. We try to plan, organise and compartmentalise our lives into neat, orderly areas, but real life is different. We never know what is round the corner, when the phone will ring to say someone, we love is ill, has had an accident or even passed away before we have had time to see them. The path we tread isn't neat or tidy. It is filled with challenges and, sometimes, really bad and shocking news. It would be wrong to say that this doesn't matter. Of course, it does, very much, but what matters even more is our ability to cope or to seek help to enable us to get through a crisis as best we can.

For me, this means turning to God. As I fret about my daughter going off to work each day whilst the rest of the family is at home, I turn to God and ask him to bless her and keep her safe. As I find myself concerned about one son in law being laid off work and another being 'furloughed' (a word I'd never heard of a month ago) I pray that these fine young men will not be too proud to ask for help if they need it, or be affronted by my offers. As my other daughter and my son try to cope with the work load of colleagues who have been put on Furlough, I pray that they have the stamina to keep going. I pray for everyone's mental health as the novelty of being at home wears thin and we realise there are only so many times we can tidy a kitchen drawer, weed a flower bed or bake our favourite cake.

My family is not even on the front line in the way so many other people are. How much more concerned must the nurses, doctors and carers we rely on so heavily, be? How much more difficult must it be for those whose families are ill or those who have lost loved ones? And yet, I still believe God walks alongside us, and even carries us, when we need him to, if only we ask.

Where exactly IS God in all this?

He is in you when you phone your neighbour, collect their prescription or do their shopping. He is in your neighbour when they help with your weeding, clean your windows or bring you some supper. Reading the Harrietsham and Lenham Villages Community Support updates, I see God in all the wonderful volunteering going on and I hear stories from Ulcombe and Boughton Malherbe about equally selfless acts. In Maidstone there are many brave people ensuring that the local hospital, essential businesses and voluntary organisations, remain open for business. The community spirit witness reading the Harrietsham Facebook page is even more prevalent than usual. I am sure it is the same in other villages.

Somehow, despite the horrific statistics we hear on the daily news, or maybe because of the seriousness of what is going on, you, God's valuable, lovely children, have risen to the occasion. It reminds me what a privilege it is to live in a close community. I thank you, and I thank the Lord, that he has shown so much of the loving way Jesus wanted us, and , indeed commanded us all to live, being played out in the acts that so many people are carrying out, every day.

I have quoted this verse of his words before but I can't think of anything more appropriate this month: **"Truly I tell you , whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."** (Matthew 25:40)

Grafty Green Stores Coronavirus Precautions




