Grafty Gourmet

This is a fantastic stew, ideal on these cold Winter nights. It is so simple and quick to prepare. It tastes even better when reheated the next day, should there be any left over.

Honey Beef Stew

2 tablespoons vegetable oil 1kg beef stewing steak, trimmed and diced

1 large onion, chopped

1 green pepper, chopped

3 sticks celery, chopped

2 large carrots, peeled and sliced

2 tablespoons honey

2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

2 teaspoons English mustard

4 tablespoons ketchup

500ml water

salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 180 C.

- **1.** In a large pot over medium high heat, heat the olive oil and quickly brown the beef pieces on all sides. Place the onion, green pepper, celery and carrots into the pot and fry for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from the heat.
- **2.** In a mixing bowl, combine the honey, lemon juice, mustard, ketchup, water, salt and pepper. Mix thoroughly.
- **3.** Transfer the meat and vegetables to a 2 litre casserole dish. Pour the ketchup mixture over the meat and vegetables.
- **4.** Bake in the oven for 20 minutes. Then reduce the oven temperature to 140 degrees and cook for a further 3 hours or until meat is tender.

News from Helen Whately - Your MP

I like the start of the year. That may sound odd, as January can be a pretty grim month; Christmas is over, the nights are long, the weather often vicious and spring still far off. But for me it's a chance to reset, start afresh, and work out how to make the most of the year ahead.

Last year was dominated by the upheaval of the EU referendum and a change of Prime Minister. The message came through to politicians loud and clear that many people want things to change. This year we must turn the referendum decision into action, and as we do so, we must understand and tackle the underlying frustrations. Else we risk going through a huge amount of turmoil to no good outcome.

Some people have been wondering why there's such a strong desire for change in the UK. If you look at the numbers Britain is doing well: the economy is growing and is now 8.1% bigger than it was before the recession. More people are in work than ever before, with 3 million more jobs than in since 2010. Society is getting fairer too with wealth more evenly distributed: disposable income for the poorest fifth of households rose by £700 last year, while it's fallen by £1000 for the richest households. Over a million more children are in good or outstanding schools (compared to 2010) and the NHS is treating more people than ever before.

But these figures overlook the people in the middle, between the richest and the poorest. Many people who are working long hours but struggling to make ends meet, living in inadequate housing but unable to afford a home of their own, finding there's no option for their children but a mediocre school, perhaps struggling to get care for a relative who needs it, and most importantly, no prospect in sight of things getting better. It's a story I hear too often when talking to my constituents and in the letters and emails I receive.

So while I want to make life better for everyone, it's those people in the middle who need to be in the spotlight in 2017. The Prime Minister gets this. In her first major speech of the year Theresa May spoke of fighting everyday injustices and building a society where everyone shares in the benefits of economic growth. She committed to lead a Government that goes beyond providing a safety net for the poorest and most vulnerable, but actively steps in to make the system fairer for every income bracket.

I'm particularly pleased that she's chosen to make mental health care a defining issue for her Government. This is something I have been campaigning for as Chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group for Mental Health and in my career before I became an MP. Theresa May is rightly putting children and young people at the centre of her ambitions. When I visit schools and colleges I often hear how let down young people feel. They tell me that there is misunderstanding and confusion about mental health, that there are long delays in getting treatment and when they do get help it's often inappropriate or inadequate. Life lived in part on social media seems to make things that much harder for young people now than when I was a teenager. Plans to train

teachers to spot children who may be struggling and help schools work more closely with the NHS are very welcome. With Brexit still dominating the political landscape, it's significant that the Prime Minister is not allowing it to crowd out other priorities.

That said, the Government will trigger Article 50 and set our withdrawal from the EU going in the spring. I'll be working to make sure we get the best deal for Kent – a deal that works for our industries, particularly farming which relies on seasonal migrant labour, for our universities, for people who voted to leave and for people who voted to remain. I'm also excited about the new opportunities that leaving the EU will bring us. As Parliamentary Private Secretary in the Department of International Trade I'm looking forward to assisting Ministers as they forge new deals and champion free trade across the world.

If last year is anything to go by, 2017 will bring twists, turns and unexpected challenges – I'm confident that we as a country are ready to take them on.

Clearing Browser History

Clearing browser history is common advice given when people ask how to speed up their PCs. The reality is that clearing the cache does not speed up the computer at all. The opposite may be true, because cache files mean that commonly used information does not have to be downloaded or generated repeatedly.

Cache is a hardware or software component that stores data so future requests for that data can be served faster; the data stored in a cache might be the result of an earlier computation, or the duplicate of data stored elsewhere. A cache hit occurs when the requested data can be found in a cache, while a cache miss occurs when it cannot. Cache hits are served by reading data from the cache, which is faster than recomputing a result or reading from a slower data store; thus, the more requests can be served from the cache, the faster the system performs.


What matters when it comes to browsing speed is the time lapse between initiating a process and receiving the results. Most people have noticed that the first time they visit a site it takes longer to open than subsequent visits, and that is thanks to the cached information saved in the browser history. If the history is deleted, the computer must do all that initializing again the next time.

There are, however, times when the browser's history requires deletion. Examples of this include when a computer doesn't have enough drive space and there are too many temporary files, when cache corruption is present, and when the user is concerned about privacy issues.

To clear your browser history:

- > Open your browser
- Locate the Setting options (use search or help)
- > Find Clear browsing history/data
- > Select what you would like to clear



I was interested to see an article last year about dreams and what they might mean. I have always been an avid dreamer, and in my childhood days I used to sleep-walk occasionally. Although I did not really do this, it was so vivid that I actually ran downstairs to the room below thinking I was going back to my room, whereupon I surprised a male student who was working late at night! Ten years ago I had the privilege of hearing the late John Paul Jackson speak at Detling.
